Applicant Qualifications:

- PhD/PsyD from an American Psychological Association/Canadian Psychological Association (APA/CPA)-accredited program in Psychology (or equivalent)
- Clinical internship from an APA/CPA-accredited program (or equivalent) required (clinical track and clinical-research track)
- · Psychology training emphasis in clinical child, pediatric psychology, and/or behavioral medicine/ health psychology specialty areas
- Evidence of scholarly production
- · Interest in further developing clinical and research skills in a pediatric hematology/oncology setting
- · All doctoral degree and fellowship admission requirements must be completed prior to beginning the fellowship

Areas of Clinical Investigation:

- Coping and adaptive styles
- Quality of life in cancer survivorship
- Sleep disruption
- Social functioning in children with cancer
- · Transition from pediatric to adult care in patients with sickle cell disease
- Cancer predisposition and adjustment in families of children with cancer

Training Program:

- Change first bullet point: We offer three fellowship tracks: 1-year clinical positions, 2-year clinical-research positions, and 2-year research positions
- Flexibility in individually tailoring balance of clinical and research responsibilities
- Exposure to various medical inpatient and outpatient populations, including those with hematologic and solid malignancies including brain tumors, sickle cell disease and other hematological disorders, cancer-predisposing genetic disorders, patients undergoing bone marrow transplantation, long-term survivors of cancer and individuals living with HIV/AIDS

Clinical Training:

- Specific training in consultation, intervention, and assessment with infants through young adults
- Specialty rotations are available in pain management, HIV/AIDS, early childhood assessment and intervention, transition, and supervision of junior trainees

Research Training:

- Specific training in grant writing, study design, data collection, data analysis and interpretation, preparation and publication of manuscripts, and presentation of findings at local, national, and international meetings
- Research activities and involvement will depend on the goals of the individual fellow

Supervision and Evaluation:

- All patient care supervised by licensed clinical psychologists in the Department of Psychology
- Fellow meets hourly postdoctoral supervised practice requirement for licensure as a psychologist with health service provider designation in Tennessee upon satisfactory completion of fellowship
