- St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is one of the world's premier research and treatment centers for pediatric catastrophic illness. The hospital has a primary emphasis in treating youth with cancer, sickle cell disease, other hematologic conditions, infectious diseases, and pediatric neurological diseases. Approximately 7,800 patients are seen each year.

SALARY AND FRINGE BENEFITS:

- Salary is above NIH postdoctoral guidelines and is set in accordance with other clinical (medical) fellows.
- Relocation assistance
- 403B retirement plan with institutional contributions in the second year of the fellowship
- St Jude comprehensive health care and dental plans (St Jude covers the cost of premiums for the employee).

- Annual professional discretionary account (may be used for conference presentation travel, purchase of books, journal subscriptions, and professional dues)
- Study materials for the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology
- Licensure-related expenses

APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS:

- Fellows must have a PhD/PsyD in clinical, counseling or school psychology from a regionally accredited institution of higher education
- Completion of a doctoral degree from an APA- or CPAaccredited program is preferred
- Completion of a doctoral internship meeting APPIC standards, APA/CPA accredited, or APPIC member internship preferred
- All doctoral degree and fellowship admission requirements must be completed prior to beginning the fellowship

Applicants for any clinical training role, including graduate students, doctoral interns, and post-doctoral fellows, must pass a drug test and background check. The background check includes criminal, license/certificates/credentials, employment/education verification, and various abuse registries. Drug and background screenings are facilitated by St. Jude onboarding. Applicants must have a health screen. The health screen must establish that the applicant is fully vaccinated.

TRAINING PROGRAM IN PEDIATRIC PSYCHOLOGY:

The postdoctoral fellowship in pediatric psychology is designed to enhance the skills of psychology trainees preparing for a career in a pediatric academic medical setting.

- Each postdoctoral fellow benefits from an individualized training team, an individualized development plan, access to world renowned interdisciplinary mentors, a top-ranked scientific environment, exceptional educational resources for professional growth, and superb benefits and professional development.
- Postdoctoral fellows are trained within a clinician scientist model and are provided with supervision in both the provision of clinical care and research. Supervision in the provision of Spanish intervention services is available.
- One- or two-year postdoctoral fellowships incorporating both clinical and scholarly activities are offered.
- A consultation-liaison approach allows the fellow to collaborate with a variety of care providers.
- St. Jude has a large international patient population, which allows fellows to enhance their skills in working with culturally and linguistically diverse populations.

- Experience working with interpreters is guaranteed.
- Patient care activities include clinical consults, brief and long-term intervention, and risk assessments and crisis management. All activities are provided in both the inpatient and outpatient settings.
- Additional clinical opportunities include specialty rotations in early childhood, pain management, infectious diseases, and umbrella supervision of junior trainees.
- Opportunities to engage in clinical activities that are typical of clinical faculty in a medical center (e.g., multidisciplinary team liaison, quality improvement projects, research collaborations, committee work) are available.
- Fellows who engage in patient care activities meet hourly postdoctoral supervised practice requirements for licensure as a psychologist with health service provider designation in Tennessee upon satisfactory completion of the fellowship.
- For fellows interested in research, opportunities will be primarily focused on manuscript writing, data analysis, grant writing, and study design. Opportunities to participate in data collection are available if interested. Opportunities to mentor junior trainees (graduate students, doctoral interns) on research products are also available.
