On behalf of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society (PIDS), we welcome you to the 23rd Annual St. Jude/PIDS Pediatric Infectious Diseases Conference featuring Pediatric Immunocompromised Hosts and Transplant ID, Pediatric Infectious Diseases Research, Global Health and Career Development. Perhaps most importantly, attendees will have an opportunity to present their original research to colleagues in pediatric infectious diseases, with original science abstract publications in basic and clinical science, epidemiology, laboratory diagnostics, global health, and health outcomes. All accepted abstracts will be presented at an in-person poster session.
