	 Respect and protect the confidentiality of patients, family members and employees at all times and in all circumstances 	
	 Possess sound understanding of the core concepts of FCC 	
	 Able to share and apply one's own experiences while also representing the global patient population at St. Jude 	
	 Wear FCC ID badge, FCC lanyard and FCC button if on St. Jude campus 	
	 Record volunteer hours and submit to FCC services for recording 	
Responsibilities:	 Demonstrate independent work initiative 	
	 Maintain effective and appropriate communication with St. Jude staff as indicated 	
	 Contribute to the development of UC agenda topics to best represent the needs of patient families served on that unit and to promote parent –staff collaboration. Possible agenda topics could include: 	
	 Orientation to the unit 	
	 Performance/Quality Improvement projects 	
	 Participation in staff development, i.e. Teach Back 	
	 Staff and parent partnership, i.e. Bedside Report 	
	 Attend UC meetings regularly and complete assigned activities 	
	 Participate in UC meetings to provide the patient and family centered care perspective to council discussions 	
	 Promote and support the FCC program and core FCC concepts in all
